Provider Access Protocol

Introduction

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to pupils at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997.

Pupil entitlement

All pupils in years 8-11 are entitled:

- to find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeships opportunities, as part of a careers programme that provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point;
- to hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships – through options events, assemblies and group discussions, and taster events;
- to understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.

For pupils of compulsory school age, these encounters are mandatory and there will be a minimum of two encounters for year 8 to 9 pupils and two encounters for year 10 to 11 pupils.

These provider encounters will be scheduled during the main school hours and the provider will be given a reasonable amount of time to, as a minimum:

- Share information about both the provider and the approved technical education qualification and apprenticeships that the provider offers.
- Explain what career routes those options could lead to.
- Provide insights into what it might be like to learn or train with that provider (including the opportunity to meet staff and pupils from the provider)
- Answer questions from pupils.

Meaningful provider encounters

One encounter is defined as one meeting/session between pupils and one provider. We are committed to providing meaningful encounters to all pupils using the 'Making it Meaningful' checklist.

In previous terms/years we have invited the following providers from the local area to speak to our pupils. These include: -

- Independent Training Providers- Bexhill College, DV8 Sussex, East Sussex College Group, Military Preparation College (MPCT), Plumpton College, University of Brighton, University of Sussex, Sussex Police, CXK.
- General FE Colleges- Bexhill College, East Sussex College Group, Plumpton College, Hartpury College, GBMet, BHASVIC, Brighton Aldridge Community Academy (BACA).
- Apprenticeship provider – Apprenticeship Support & Knowledge (ASK), The Grand Hotel, Heathercroft Training Academy.
- Sixth form – Hailsham Academy Trust, Seaford Head Sixth Form Centre, Eastbourne College.

Destinations of our pupils: Last year our year 11 pupils moved to a range of providers in the local area after school:

- Independent Training Providers- 79%
- General FE College –79%
- Apprenticeship provider – 7%
- Sixth form - 4%
- Employment (no training) -5%
