Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

We are excited to introduce our new Personal Excellence Reward Cards, designed to celebrate the many ways our students demonstrate our school values every day.

Pastoral and Senior staff will give students a reward card when they observe positive behaviour, effort, or actions that reflect personal excellence, such as helping others, showing kindness, working hard, or representing the school in a positive way. Students write their name on the card and place it in the Reward box at Student Support. Points are added later, and a weekly draw recognises and rewards students who have made a positive contribution to the school community.

We are also partnering with local businesses, which will be provided with reward cards. This allows students to be recognised for courteous and positive behaviour both inside and outside of school.

This is a trial initiative, and we will reflect at the end of Term 2 on how it is working and make any adjustments as needed. This initiative aims to reinforce our culture of personal excellence, celebrate student achievements, and strengthen connections between the school and the wider community.

Thank you for supporting us in encouraging and recognising the positive contributions of all our students.

This week we met with the Year 7 Council and received some really valuable feedback. We will be putting together a summary shortly in the format of "You Said, We Did" so that students can clearly see how their voices are heard and how we act on feedback wherever possible.

We would also like to thank the 56 parents who took part in our parent survey last week. Your feedback is incredibly valuable and provides us with important insights to help shape the best experience for our students.

We are also asking our students and staff similar questions so we can compare feedback across our school community. Your time is appreciated, and answering 2 to 5 questions each week will ensure your voice is heard and that your views are taken into account. You can find this week's survey link below.

Please can I draw your attention to the lockdown practice letter included in this newsletter on Page 3. The lockdown practice will take place on Monday. We understand this can be upsetting for students, but it is important to carry out this practice to ensure our safety processes are fully tested.

Finally, thank you to everyone who attended our fireworks event. We are delighted to share that the event raised £7,500 plus sponsorship, and after costs, Stone Cross Primary School and Willingdon Community School will receive nearly £2,000 each, which Willingdon will put toward supporting our school programmes and initiatives. Your support and participation are greatly appreciated.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Lockdown practice - Monday, 17th November 2025

I am writing to inform you about an upcoming reminder of our Stay Safe Procedures at Willingdon Community School. This is in preparation for a practice lockdown that will take place on **Monday, 17th November 2025**.

During coaching time on Monday, students will receive a briefing that explains the three different options that can be used in the event of a threat to the school, ranging from a Fire Evacuation to a school Lockdown. This reminder is being provided in advance of the practice to ensure that students are familiar with the procedures.

A presentation will be shown to the students, highlighting the different bells that will sound in the event of a lockdown and clarifying their role in such a situation. It is important for students to understand that these scenarios are rare, and the purpose of practicing them is to ensure that everyone knows their role and can remain confident and calm if such a situation were to occur.

The consistent message that students have been given is that during any lockdown procedure, their role involves the following:

1. Following all instructions from their teacher without question or delay.
2. Avoiding the urge to look and see what is going on.
3. Remaining in silence so that instructions can be heard and their location is not obvious. This includes keeping their phones on silent and put away in their bags.

These instructions apply regardless of which procedure is implemented.

We kindly request that you refrain from contacting your child during the practice, as doing so would place others at risk in a real-life situation.

It is important that these rehearsals are as realistic as possible so that we can learn any lessons and make necessary policy amendments based on the practice. Our students have shown excellence in practicing the fire evacuation procedures, consistently exiting the building in a short amount of time and in silence. We anticipate similar support from students during the upcoming lockdown practice this term and look forward to providing feedback to you afterwards.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in ensuring the safety and security of our students. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Clinic information for missed Flu vaccination

Dear Parents and Guardians,

The Immunisation Service have recently attended your school for the Flu vaccinations.

If you have already completed a form and your child wasn't vaccinated in school, you will have received a separate email with clinic booking instructions and do not need to complete another form. Please refer to the 'How do I book an appointment for my child to be vaccinated' section in this email.

If you did not return a consent form, but would like your child to receive this vaccination, it's not too late. Please see guidance below on how to complete an online consent form, which will re-open one working day after the school visit, and subsequently book an appointment.

How do I consent / refuse to my child having these vaccinations?

- 1 **Visit** the following web address: <https://www.susseximmunisations.co.uk/Forms/Flu>
- 2 **Enter and confirm** your preferred email address – *you will receive a confirmation email following submission of the consent form.*
- 3 **Enter the school code: SX114592**
- 4 **Complete and submit the consent form**, indicating your choice of consent - *Please ensure you provide the child's registered address and GP.*
- 5 **Book an appointment** by following the steps below.

How do I book an appointment for my child to be vaccinated?

- 1 **Follow this link:** <https://www.susseximmunisations.co.uk/clinicbooking/booking> to book an appointment at one of our Community Catch up Clinics, for your child to receive the vaccination(s) – *You will require your booking reference number which can be found within the email you receive(d) from Cinnamon once your consent form has/had been submitted..*
- 2 **Arrange for an adult to accompany your child** to their clinic appointment.
