Sports Day - Thursday, 10th July



The My Health, My School Survey 2024/25 - Years 7 & 8 only

Dear Parents/Carers,

We are writing to inform you that your child's class/year group will be completing the My Health, My School Survey, a survey created, developed and managed by the Health & Wellbeing Service (Leeds City Council). The survey asks children and young people questions about their health and wellbeing and about their school/education setting, in order to gather their honest views and opinions on these significant topics. This data can then be used to target specific interventions to improve areas of life for these children and young people. It can also be used to highlight where they are performing well.

The survey will be completed by pupils/students in class on individual computers and they will be supported by a member of school staff who can answer any questions they may have. To help your child answer some of the questions included in the survey, their teacher may also ask them to complete a **pupil diary** a week before completing the survey.

As the survey is **confidential and anonymous**, this means your child **will not be asked** to give their name, date of birth or address at any stage during the survey. This also means that it **will not be** possible for anybody, including any member of the school or Leeds City Council, to know which pupil gave any of the information.

How will the results be used?

Individual school results can be used by the school (schools will only have access to their own data), East Sussex School Health, East Sussex County Council and Leeds City Council. In addition, the survey may also be shared with organisations, such as the University of Leeds and Leeds Beckett University. Local authority wide data (an average of all schools in a particular local authority) may also be shared between these organisations, which does not link any individual school to the data.

Will my child's survey results be secure?

We will comply fully with all data protection legislation. This means we will keep your child's data safe and secure, now and in the future.

The East Sussex School Health Service can support your child with their health needs between the ages of 4 and 19yrs. If you need help, support or advice on a wide range of health and wellbeing issues, including emotional health and wellbeing, sleep, healthy lifestyles or wetting and soiling, please contact them on:


The assembly was designed to inspire our students as they start to consider their work experience placements and future pathways and how they can build their own "employability toolkit."

Day to day tasks:

- Day to day tasks:
 Depending on where you work, you could:
 Discuss plans and job instructions with clients or site managers.
 Cut and shape timber for floorboards, doors, skirting boards and window frames.
 Make and fit structures like staircases, door frames, roof timbers and partition walls.
 Assemble fitted and free-standing furniture.
 Install kitchens, cupboards and shelving.
 Build wooden supports called shuttering which holds concrete that has not dried yet in place. yet in place.
- Fit interiors in shops, bars, restaurants, offices and public buildings.
 Construct stage sets for theatre, film and TV productions.

Carpenters and Joiners make and install wooden structures, fittings and furniture.

Routes into the industry

You can get into this job through:

College You could take a college course like:

- Level 2 or 3 in Bench Joinery
 Level 2 or 3 Diploma in Site Carpentry
 T Level in On Site Construction

Apprenticeship You could do a:

- Carpentry and Joinery Intermediate or Advanced Apprenticeship with a focus on Site Carpentry or Architectural Joinery.
- Wood Product Manufacturing Operative Intermediate Apprenticeship, which has a focus on furniture making.

You'll do on the job training and spend time at college or with a training provider.

Four or Five GCSEs at grade 9 to 4 (A* to C), or equivalent, including English and Maths.

Salary*

£17,000 for a starter, rising to £38,000 for an experienced Carpenter. The average UK salary is £31,787.
