I hope you all had a lovely Easter break.

Unfortunately, one of our students was involved in a road traffic accident yesterday. We send her and the family our best wishes and hope for a swift recovery.

I have attached our Parent Engagement Strategy for parents who wish to read this. We discussed the strategy at our full governors meeting. One governor rightly pointed out that parent engagement is not always about a 'popularity contest'. Engagement is sometimes about working together through difficult conversations to help a child attend school or for a child to accept and own their choice of behaviours. We continue to work hard, side by side with parents/carers and ensure that it never feels the school is at odds with anyone's parenting choices or style. This

is always going to be a difficult road to navigate through but ultimately, we all have the same goal and that's ensuring

every child is happy, safe and achieves their best.

Year 11 mock results have been given and whilst there is much success, there are pockets of work to still do. We hope the tips that our experienced parent governors have been sharing with our parent body are helpful. We know this is a really tough time for many parents and students. As children are maturing to young adults, it is often easier to avoid the confrontation and keep the peace. However, our children need us more than ever to be the parents. We need to ensure there are boundaries and structure in place to allow our children to thrive. It is essential that children are working to their revision schedules, completing at least two hours of homework/revision a night alongside some top up revision at some point during the weekend. We have talked to the Year 11 students about having pride in everything they do. They have been in education since the age of four and we want them to have achieved their potential. We are so lucky that teachers are giving up weekends, holidays and after schools to offer the cohort extra intervention. The staff do go the extra mile for our students and I and we are very grateful and appreciative of this.

We said goodbye to Mrs Turpin from the English department at the end of last term. Mrs Oram, an English teacher will be joining us in Term 6. We also said goodbye to Mr Craggs, an ex student who had joined us as a Learning Mentor. It was lovely that his parting words to me were 'I may be back in six weeks!' We will shortly be recruiting more Learning Mentors and Learning Support Professionals for our next academic year. These adults are so important in our school community and we are very lucky to attract such a strong field to both roles.

Well done to all of our students on a successful Term 4. We are so lucky to have incredible young people that demonstrate personal excellence in all that they do. It was lovely to be part of a school trip to Belgium recently. One student who was lagging behind said to me, Mrs May, I just need to take a minute to reflect by myself and thank the soldiers for all that they have done for us. Another student was patting the arm of another in comfort when he had temporarily lost his wallet. They demonstrate courage, kindness and goodness in so much that they do. I'm immensely proud of them and I thank you for choosing us to further nurture and support them in their journey to adulthood.
