

# PARIENT BULLETIN

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Dear Parents and Carers,

The start back to Term 4 has been very smooth. Thank you for helping us ensure students adhere to the uniform policy and come back prepared and ready to learn. Year 11 began their mock exams yesterday and we are hoping this round of exams will show an improvement in the data since November. Many Year 11s have their next destination planned and have a renewed energy for their learning. We have 40

interventions which are running for Year 11 and there is great attendance to the sessions. Please do encourage your child to attend and keep giving 100%. It can be at this time of year that we hear comments like 'I only need a .... Grade' or 'I only need two subjects. It is important that as a community, we work together to value every subject and encourage students to do well across the board, not just in what they need in the short term.

Year 9 have now made their option choices and we have begun the process of meeting as many first choices as possible. This process does take a long time so students are likely to find out next term what their options are. The date will be confirmed on the release of options later this term.

Can I remind parents that we will no longer be running Activity Days in the same way as previous years? Parent voice remarked on the expense of trips in July primarily because coaches are so expensive for us at this time of year. Also, student voice has commented that trips should be littered throughout the year which has been the approach we are now invested in.

This week, we have had our external visit from our county advisor which went very well. He remarked on the strength of systems we have in place for behaviour and attendance. Our current data predictions for all year groups are also really encouraging. Behaviour and engagement in all the lessons we saw was very strong. We are now encouraging our teachers to take more risks with paired and group work so that students start to own their own learning more and think harder.

We have also welcomed an inspection form SACRE (Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education). The feedback was very positive and we look forward to receiving the report in the following weeks.

We have welcomed some American trainee teachers who will be spending the term with us. We are really excited at the plans they have to support our school and share strategies for effective teaching and learning.

I am in the process of developing our parental engagement strategy to further consolidate and strengthen our communication and links with you all. I would welcome any parents who would be kind enough to look at the strategy and offer any other feedback in person or by email. The last two days have been busy with interviews preparing our school for September. We have made some very strong appointments which we are delighted with. So much lovely feedback has come from candidates regarding the courtesy and kindness of our student body, how engaged they are with their learning and how the ethos of the school is clear from the moment they enter the school. We will share more information on appointments later in the year once all appointments have been confirmed from references and checks.

#### NO. 10 DOWNING STREET


On 9<sup>th</sup> February, Willingdon School were given the incredible opportunity to visit Number 10 Downing Street for a 'Women in STEM' event. A small group of Year 9 girls were filled with excitement as they passed through security at Downing Street before being given the once-in-a-lifetime chance to knock on the door of Number 10 to discover what was inside. The students then had time to hear from four pioneering women in STEM (Claire Coutinho, Dr Suzanne Imber, Professor Dame Angela McLean, and Dr Nikki Kanani) who shared their experiences and what led them to a career in STEM, including the many obstacles and triumphs they faced along the way. Every student reported afterwards how much this Q&A session opened their eyes to the wonders of STEM, with 100% of students claiming to have learnt more about STEM careers and 100% of them claiming that the trip made them realise women can also be successful in STEM. We were then very privileged to have been given a tour of the building, which provided insight into life as a Prime Minister, leading to one particular Willingdon student now wanting to pursue a career in politics! Overall it was a tremendously inspiring day, and one which will be treasured by all of the students for years to come.
