Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been wonderful to have a number of you visit us over the last two weeks on our parent tours. We will offer another round in term three and four.

Recently we have conducted student and staff voice on our lunch and break times. 540 students and 72 staff took part. As a result of the feedback, we have decided to increase lunch by ten minutes and reduce tutor and break by five minutes each.

Very valid points were made about lunchtime feeling rushed, there being not much time for interventions or extracurricular and staff wanting more time to set up for practicals in their lessons.

Students and staff did raise concern about the previous time we had a longer lunch and how a minority of students misbehaved. We are going to have to ensure we work harmoniously as a community and avoid problems happening from boredom of a longer lunch.

Thank you to our year ten parents and carers who attended our first parents evening of the year. We hope you found it informative and valuable.

Reward points update

ALTERNATIVE CURRICULUM DAY - NOV 2023

Thank you to all the students for their engagement and fabulous innovations on Alternative Curriculum Day on Tuesday. It was lovely to see the students leading their own learning and contributing to the planning of the day.

Years 10 and 11

As part of their statutory entitlement to RSHE, our KS4 students enjoyed a range of talks, with different formats, lengths and venues, focussed on careers, post 16 choices, including university and apprenticeships. Tutor based activities included work on budgeting, financial choices, debt and fraud. Over 20 staff contributed their time to either record or deliver talks about adaptability, resilience and routes through education and jobs. HR, finance and the business team put together real-world examples of budgeting, tax, wages and accounting sessions in a marketplace activity. We also were able to invite guest speakers from the worlds of construction and business who also gave their time freely. Feedback from the student exit tickets on the day was really informative with lots of positive feedback, suggestions for future events and requests for further careers talks.

KS3 STEM Day

STEM(Science, Technology and Mathematics) and STEAM (STEM + Arts) are the primary emerging labour markets that our students need to be aware of. 1 in 5 jobs in the coming years will be in STEAM and currently only 25% of those are filled by females.

All year groups had the opportunity to work in teams, emulating real -life team working arrangements that they may need in the future. Collaboration, cooperation, compromise and solutionfinding were at the heart of the activities that built on curriculum learning and educational visits that have occurred over the last two terms.

Year 7 designed seismic resistant buildings, costing the project following design processes and pitching solutions. Year 8 completed engineering research, designed prototypes and gathered at the end of the day to share their designs. Year 9 followed up their Towner Gallery visit with a series of creative textiles sessions culminating in the most spectacular fashion show!

Massive congratulations to all the student contributors and especially to the winners of the design projects.

Y8 STEM Skills Fair School Trip

On Tuesday 21st November, nearly 100 Year 8 students from Willingdon School headed to the London Science Museum for the annual STEM Skills Fair! This was a hugely exciting opportunity for students to hear from a range of women in STEM about their careers through the 'Honest Q&A' session, followed by a interactive 'Meet the Employer' session where students took part in a range of challenges linked to STEM careers. Students then had some time to explore the rest of the museum to discover more about the world of science and STEM.

Based on student feedback, 92% of students learnt more about STEM through the London Science Museum trip, and 72% of students increased their interest for STEM in terms of a career path.




