## Curriculum - what your child learns with us

In a time where schools are asked to do more far beyond the classroom, it is worth reminding ourselves that our primary focus is giving students a good academic and moral education. At Willingdon Community School, a huge amount of thought and evaluation goes into our curriculum. Our most recent Ofsted report stated that: "Leaders have created a curriculum which

is carefully planned and sequenced. Content is ambitious for all pupils, including disadvantaged pupils and those with special educational needs and/or disabilities."

We know that when our students leave us in Year 11, we want them to leave with more than just a good set of exam results, we want them going out into the world showing ambition, respect, compassion, courtesy and honesty. Each year we review our curriculum to ensure that it is meeting the requirements of our local and national context and keeping up to date with the ever-changing world and the challenges this brings.

I recently spoke to 130 trainee teachers at Brighton University about what makes our curriculum special at Willingdon Community School. I was able to talk with immense pride about our students and their engagement with the 19 subjects on offer at Key Stage 3, and 23 we offer at Key Stage 4. The breadth in which our curriculum has is down to the fact that we know that it is better for students to keep as many doorways open for as long as possible as they might not know what they want to do with their futures yet.

Sometimes for parents and carers, it can be hard to illicit a response from children about what they are learning at school, but we have worked hard to ensure that parents and carers can access these details clearly on our website: https://willingdonschool.org.uk/learning/curriculum
