This year we have celebrated World Book Day a little differently and tried to embrace the 'Read Your Way' theme. Our separate article about World Book Day is well worth a read!

World Book Day is just one day but reading for pleasure can happen on any day of the year. We hope that students will keep reading, keep empathising and keep exploring new ideas.

On Thursday, a group of 14 Year 10 students attended the AMSP Mathematics Enrichment Event 2024 at Bexhill 6<sup>th</sup> Form College. The event comprised of a number of workshops promoting the enjoyment of Maths, providing information on the options after GCSE as well as widening the awareness of Maths in careers. Students particularly liked the session on NASA's Perseverance rover mission to Mars.

A large number of Year 10 students were also involved in a Careers Fair at East Sussex College Eastbourne where local colleges and businesses, as well as the NHS, police, army, RAF and Royal Navy, were in attendance. Student feedback was that there were a good variety stands for all interests, including interactive stands with competitions and games, and that they had gained useful information to help with their future pathways post-16.

Finally, we have been celebrating careers week across the school. We are ambitious for all our students and encourage you to keep the topic of careers alive! 


