Dear Parent/Carers

From our parent engagement sessions, many have found it useful to understand our behaviour policy. As part of our behaviour policy we utilise a room for internal sanction called 'Reflection'. This is to prevent external suspensions which feature permanently on a child's formal school record and also to give the child a chance to reflect on their behaviours that have caused disruption to other members of our community. For the vast majority of our students, they will never see or visit reflection as they behave impeccably each and every day.

However, to ensure there is understanding and clarity for the students who are sent to reflection and the families who are contacted, we have outlined some amendments below to help the success of this measure.

When a student is placed in reflection, they will be read or will read the expectations of the room. They will then sign and date to show they understand and have had this expectation outlined to them. The rules of the room are in this bulletin so parents have the full understanding of the expected conduct of our internal suspension room.

If a student refuses to be read or read the expectations, we will follow the behaviour policy for a failed internal suspension. If a student refuses to follow the expectations having entered the room, this again will be a failed internal suspension. Students will be expected to complete the failed internal suspension before continuing with their lessons again. The Year and SEND teams will know who is placed in the room and ensure that any adjustments are made for specific needs to allow for a successful internal placement.

We hope this gives you clarity about the purpose of the room and how this is a significant step in ensuring all children can meet our personal excellence values.

Reflection room expectations

You have been placed in reflection as a form of internal suspension to avoid a fixed term suspension from the school. You must have a successful day to be reintegrated into your classes.

Please place your bags and coats in a cube for the duration of the day. Including break and lunch.

Your phone must be handed over and placed into the safe or switched off and placed in your bag.

You must sit in the booth assigned to you and work in silence. Please put your hand up if you need support.

Year 10 and 11, please complete work assigned to you by your class teacher or homework and revision. You can access the main learning platforms only e.g. Sparxmaths, Educake

Year 7/8/9, please complete work assigned to you by your class teacher or homework. Alternatively you can complete lessons on Oak Academy or the work book.

Do not leave your booth unless you have been given permission by a member of staff.


Break and Lunch

The plan recognises factors that are important for journeys to school such as enabling safer and more accessible journeys, the benefits to health and wellbeing from more active travel, even if this is part for part of your journey or being undertaken on certain days of the week.

Many of you will often be combining the school run with other journeys, so undertaking multiple trips, to get to work or for other purposes, so the plan recognises the importance of having a connected transport network.





