Dear Parents and Carers

I use this as a metaphor for the work in the school this week and we are proud of the students who remain focused and working hard up to half term. So many students are giving it their all at the moment, whether that be in Sports, Performing Arts or in exam preparations. This is where the ambition in Willingdon truly lies. I commend the students and staff for giving up so much of their free time, including all day Saturday, to make this a success! Whilst there are many tired faces amongst the student body this week, the energy in the school from being ambitious and working hard throughout their lessons and extra-curricular activities keeps the momentum going.

#### **Teaching**

This academic year we are focusing on our Progress Every Lesson (PEL) strand of **Engagement**. We know that if students are engaged, they will want to learn. We have decided upon three main priorities in order to improve engagement in the classroom.

Our three priorities to improve engagement:

#### Priority 1 – Get students talking:

In order to develop oracy by students discussing their thoughts and thinking hard about their responses.

How? E.g Think, Pair, Share: Students are given a question to think about on their own, then to share their thoughts with a partner, then prepare to share with the class. (Morrison McGill- The Teacher Toolkit 2015)

#### Priority 2 – Get students thinking hard:

In order to develop students cognitive abilities by making them sit within the 'struggle zone' so that the work is not too easy or too hard. How? Card sorts: Students are asked to rank/order/prioritise/categorise information based on limited information. (Counsell – History and Literacy 2004)

#### **Priority 3 – Formative Assessment:**

In order to make all students feel involved and ensure that we know if students are 'getting it.' How? Assessment for Learning methods including mini whiteboards, quick quizzes, traffic light cards etc. William – Embedded Formative Assessment 2011)

In addition to these areas of focus, we want to be making the most of the 50 minutes we get each lesson with our students. To ensure engagement from the start, we have introduced 'do now' tasks so that there is consistency in how lessons start. The idea is that students have a very clear task to complete in silence when they arrive in the classroom. This helps settle them, and recap some of their prior learning.

#### Cross-phase curriculum working group Wednesday 29<sup>th</sup> January

We were delighted to be joined by colleagues from <u>Willingdon Primary School</u>, <u>Stone Cross School</u>, and <u>Polegate School</u> as well as other local primaries to share good practice on Monday and join up our thinking. We realised we have so much to learn from our colleagues in primary to help make the transition from Year 6 to Year 7 even more successful. We want to thank all those teachers who gave up their evening in helping support the long term development of the young people in our local community.

We also want to encourage parents to further explore the curriculum section of our website which details what students learn in each subject over the five years. #### **Student Council Meeting**
