

Sparx and Resilience



Aiming for 100% for Everyone

As we enter 2024 we are raising the bar for Maths Homework and developing students study skills.

A common student and parental concern is "how do I improve/revise my Maths?"

This is especially important as Year 11 prepare for their exams. However if we can build independent Mathematicians in Years 7 to 10, they will find preparing for Maths assessments is part of their weekly habits.

Sparx Maths is designed to be achievable and for everyone to be able to reach 100%, whilst providing some achievable challenge. We can see from our classes that some older students stop when they reach a question that they cannot do. Some of our students will stop and down tools as soon as they see something that takes them slightly out of their comfort zone. Not all students are watching the support videos that are there to help them. Please remind your children to use the support videos.

We are moving the homework expectation to achieving 100% and have put in ways to help students to achieve this at school. Sparx has been proven to boost student progress if used correctly. The most successful students in Year 11 are those that have strategies for when they are finding problems difficult instead of brushing them under the carpet. Working through these questions is where the learning happens!

To help students to reach 100% we are offering a daily drop in help room in IT2 with a Maths Teacher from Monday to Friday to help them with those questions they are stuck on. There are also KS3 and KS4 homework clubs open to all students to come and get help with their work.

We are reminding students need to start their homework earlier. This will allow us to support them earlier and for them to ask questions before the deadline. Please can you encourage students to start their Maths homework before the weekend, it is set on Tuesdays. This will allow us tackle tricky topics in Monday's lessons before the Tuesday deadline. If your child is getting frustrated with the homework and needs help please direct them to talk to one of us so that we can help them.

Learn to help yourself when you get stuck!

Start your homework before the weekend.

Watch the videos and make notes.

Come along to the Maths drop in sessions at lunchtime

Ask your teacher for advice before the deadline.

This will apply for the homework tasks set from 9th January onwards.

Year 11 Revision Support

It is that time of year where all students are starting to ask for past papers to practice on. Whilst past paper practice is one of the best ways to revise Maths, often students forget to get feedback on them with a member of staff.

Step in Method Maths!, This is program that will allow students to practice past papers until their heart is content and track their progress, all in one place.

Moving forward from January, Maths homework for Year 11 will be based on Methos Maths with the same drop in sessions available to them.

Method Maths will also allow them to filter by topic so that they can get lots of practice on topics that they are finding tricky.

Revision checklists and resource links are available on Edulink for the whole year group.

Remember to practice the things that you find tough and not to keep repeating the things that you are comfortable with!
