





#### **Information from Stagecoach**

The cheapest bus tickets are the £3 single fare cap ticket, the U19 East Sussex DayRider for £3.75 and then the Freedom weekly ticket at £15 - to use this, all Under 19 year olds need to have ID – and they would need to apply for a 3i-D card here:

If students are wearing school uniform, they may not need ID but it seems some bus services ask for ID whilst others don't. It may therefore be worthwhile getting the above 3-iD card.

We would like to warmly welcome all Year 8 students back for the new year and hope that everyone has had an enjoyable Christmas. Year 8 have settled back into the routine of school very well this week earning an abundance of reward points for their efforts across the board. We would just like to remind all parents about the importance of sending students to school wearing the correct school uniform, on non PE days this includes wearing a tie and blazer. Students should also be wearing black school shoes rather than trainers and nails and eyelashes need to be 'natural-looking'. If there are any concerns regarding uniform then please contact the 'pastoral 8' email address ahead of time so we can get the message out to teachers not to sanction. Thank you for your cooperation!

In other news, we would like to recognise Sonny-R C's achievements over the past year. He is in the talent programmes for four Olympic sports (Flag Football GB development U13, Handball, Basketball [although he is currently out of this talent pathway cycle], and Athletics), and has also qualified for international competition in powerlifting. At the moment he is playing U14 National League Premier Basketball, is in the South Regional Academy for Handball, and last summer represented Sussex in the summer in shot put (number 9 in the UK for 2024) and discus (number 18 in the UK for 2024) with notable wins at the Sussex champs, Inter-counties champs (where he competed for Sussex), and the South of England champs in the shot put. Unfortunately, Sonny-R has injured his ankle at present but we wish him well soon and to be able to get back to his training and ready for a busy 2025 of competing again.

#### YEAR 9 - IMPERIAL WAR MUSEUM AND HOLOCAUST EDUCATION SESSION.

#### Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> March 7.00am - 5.30pm

#### Dear Parent/Carer

We are arranging a trip for Year 9 students to visit the Imperial War Museum in London. As part of the trip students will have time to explore the displays which include exhibitions on World War One, World War Two and Peace and Security 1945 to 2014. This is a fantastic opportunity to support and enhance your child's knowledge of 20<sup>th</sup> century history and for them to engage with historical artefacts from photographs and letters to a Spitfire and a T34 tank. During the day the students will also engage with museum staff who will run an education session focussed on the Holocaust, students will then have an opportunity to visit the Holocaust gallery.

The coaches will be leaving from school promptly at 7.15am, so students will need to arrive and register with staff in the canteen at **7.00am.** Please consider how your child will get to school, as the coaches have to leave Willingdon before the school buses arrive.

We anticipate arriving back at school at approximately 5.30pm. Students are expected to wear their school PE kit so that they are easily identifiable and so that they have comfortable walking shoes for the museum. A packed lunch will be required. If your child is entitled to free school meals, please indicate this when you make your payment on ParentPay and this can be collected before we depart.

If your child suffers with travel sickness that requires medication not currently held in school, they will need to take the medicine before they travel in the morning and you will need to provide the medication in a named box, to be administered by a member of staff, before we travel back. If medication is required, please indicate this when you make your payment on ParentPay. Students with asthma should carry their inhalers with them.

We have 44 places on the trip. The cost for the whole trip is £41.00, which covers all travel and venue costs. To confirm your child's place on the trip, would you kindly pay via ParentPay. The payment will secure your child's place on the coach and the trip will operate on a first come first served basis. (ParentPay will open at 9am on Monday morning).

Year 10/11 Important information: Outstanding Td/IPV and MenACWY vaccinations FOR STUDENTS WHO DID NOT RECEIVE THE Td/IPV & MenACWY IN YEAR 9 - WILLINGDON SCHOOL DO NOT HOLD THIS INFORMATION. PLEASE CONTACT THE IMMUNISATION TEAM DIRECT.

The Immunisation Service are coming into school for a **Tetanus/Diphtheria/Polio** (**Td/IPV**) and **Meningitis ACWY** (**MenACWY**) vaccination catch up session on **25**<sup>th</sup> **February 2025** to offer these vaccines to students in years **10** and **11** who have **not yet** received the Td/IPV & MenACWY vaccinations, which are routinely offered in Year 9.

If this applies to your child and:

You have already completed and returned a consent form; the Immunisation Team will contact you prior to offering this vaccination.

OR

You consented for your child to receive this vaccination at a different school, and it is still outstanding, please contact your local Immunisation team on **01273 696011 EXT 4931** so that they can update your child's consent form.

OR

You have not yet consented and would like to do so please request the consent information from your child's school.






Well done to Year 11 students who have demonstrated great focus and engagement during lesson walk throughs this week.
