Dear Parents/Carers,

As we enter the month of December, many students enjoy the countdown to Christmas. As a community we find great opportunities to come together in December to celebrate the excellence that exists at Willingdon Community School. We hope all can enjoy the Christmas Concert and Christmas Fayre which takes place on Thursday 19th. We often find ourselves reiterating the point that every minute matters at school, and we know that this time of year colds and illnesses can be frequent but it is so important that

students find that inner resilience and still come into school where possible. For Year 11, we have introduced the '5 days of Christmas' attendance challenge with a chance of winning a prize including prom tickets, leavers hoodies, and chocolate for those students with 100% attendance from Monday, 25th November (there are of course exemptions for authorised medical appointments etc). Years 7 - 10 have the '12 days of Christmas, attendance challenge also commencing from Monday, 25th November with chocolates, sweets, gift cards and vouchers available to win.

Recently, we have seen the very best personal excellence from our students on various trips including the rugby game at Twickenham at the weekend, the Year 7 trip to London, the Year 8 trip to the Science Museum, Year 9 Duke of Edinburgh, and the trip to Fishbourne Roman Palace. We want to thank colleagues who have gone above and beyond to plan these extracurricular activities for our young people. The students who took part in these trips showed the school values of respect, compassion, and courtesy.

To further celebrate our school values, students with the highest number of achievement points have also been rewarded with a 'Hot Chocolate with the Head', where they can provide even more student voice directly to Mrs May or one of her Deputies. One of the emergent themes has been young peoples' concerns about vaping in the wider community. As a school, we have a very strict policy on vapes, including the seizing of any e-cigarettes, disposable vapes or similar products, sending them off to be destroyed and a follow up sanction for any students involved. We have installed vape detectors in the school which detect the specific vapour emitted from such devices. We take the health and wellbeing of our students incredibly seriously, and as part of our RSHE programme, explain the dangers of vaping. We have heard of recent cases in the news of irreparable harm which has been caused to secondary school aged students and would ask of our parents/carers to reinforce the message about the dangers and laws on vaping. The three weeks leading up to Christmas should be a time for further celebration and student voice on the positives of our community and what we can do even better to support their wellbeing and learning. Our Year 9s have the publication of the options booklet to look forward to, as well as a third round of student voice on the options blocks. We recently invited Cathal Lynch (an external verifier) to accredit the hard work we are putting into staff and student wellbeing at Willingdon Community School, and we hope to publish his findings with you soon. On a final note, we promote to students the importance of courtesy and respect, can we please remind all parents/carers collecting their children at the end of the day to park considerately and avoid parking in the bus stops and blocking neighbours' driveways.




Sparx Reader

Parent Portal

Parents of children using Sparx Maths will currently receive a weekly email that updates them on their child's homework progress that week. The email is sent 3 days before the hand-in date of their Maths homework.

There is also a callout in this email which mentions that Reading homework information is also available to view.



If parents click on the link in this email, they will get taken to our Parent Portal, where they can choose to view homework progress for any Sparx learning system their child is using. For Sparx Reader, parents can see progress with the current and previous homework, and browse books that their child has been reading as part of their current homework.

Please note that each email contains a unique link to Parent Portal, and this link will expire 7 days after the email was sent.

Dear Parents and Carers,

This week, the first Year 9 reports were sent home. These reports were printed and distributed to students during tutor time on Wednesday. We have also emailed a copy to parents and carers, and uploaded the report to the Arbor portal, which you can access under the "Report Cards" section. The teachers' lists for Terms 1 and 2 are also available there.

Reports for other year groups will be sent in the coming weeks, as indicated in the table below. The report provides an overview of your child's progress in their subjects. It's important to note that this progress is measured against each student's individual KS2 SATs scores. As a result, students with different KS2 data may be achieving similar grades, but their progress may vary. This is a standard process in secondary schools, where performance measures such as Progress 8 are based on KS2 data. The target outcome for each student in their subjects, which will guide their progress toward GCSEs, is determined by their KS2 scores. We use nationally recognised assessment companies to predict these target outcomes for every subject.

In addition to progress, the report will include feedback on your child's behaviour, engagement, and homework in each subject. These will be rated as Excellent, Good, Inconsistent, or Cause for Concern. A rubric explaining these ratings will be provided alongside the report, ensuring full clarity on each grading. We aim for transparency, so no grade should come as a surprise. Our teachers are encouraged to keep in touch throughout the year if there are any concerns about your child's performance.

As is typical in many secondary schools, we do not provide written reports but instead supplement them with our Positive Progress Parent Evenings and Meet the Tutor events, where you will have an opportunity to discuss your child's progress directly with their teachers.

We appreciate your ongoing support and look forward to working with you to support your child's development.
