SUPPORTING STUDENTS ON THE JOURNEY FROM PRIMARY TO SECONDARY SCHOOL

At Willingdon Community School, we pride ourselves on the level of support we offer children and parents throughout the entire transition process. It is important to us that we work with the local primary schools in advance of students choosing their secondary school. There is a huge range of activities offered so that during their time at primary school, students start to become part of the Willingdon family. We have a specialist pastoral team fixed in Year 7 that are experts on transition and work closely with each and every feeder school. This includes the Heads of Year and a non-teaching Pastoral Support Leader.

Once your child has selected Willingdon Community School, they will receive a visit from key staff to begin the transition process. A programme then follows which is full of transition events, helping students become familiar with our expectations, our systems and giving them a chance to form positive relationships with their peers and staff.



Transitioning from primary to secondary school can also be a new and daunting experience for parents too. There are many opportunities in Year 7 to help parents with this change and these range from Parent Forums to regular Positive Progress Evenings, along with an in-person Meet the Coach Evening in Term 1.

IGNITING CURIOSITY

At Willingdon Community School, your child will experience a curriculum that ignites curiosity and expects the very best from every learner. In Key Stage 3, students study the full range of core and foundation National Curriculum subjects, with teaching adapted to meet the needs of every individual. We are proud of the breadth we offer, giving students the chance to explore a wide range of subjects across a full three years. The curriculum is reviewed annually to keep it vibrant and relevant.

This breadth leads to deeper learning across subjects from Drama to Design Technology, separate Humanities (Geography, History and Ethics) to Music, Art, IT and a choice of language, all alongside the core subjects of Maths, Science, English, PE and RSHE.

In Year 9, students make their option choices for Key Stage 4, shaping a bespoke curriculum built around their potential. As a fully comprehensive school, we have developed a system flexible enough to reflect the needs, interests and talents of every learner, and we use student voice to help design our GCSE offer. In recent years this has brought Astronomy, Business Studies, Psychology, Sociology, Statistics, Travel and Tourism, and Child Development into our options menu, alongside subjects already studied at Key Stage 3.

Careers education runs as a golden thread through the whole school curriculum. Students learn about a variety of workplace settings, with careers education embedded into lessons and extracurricular activities offered by staff throughout the school.



Key Stage 4 (Years 10 - 11)

In Key Stage 4, every student follows an examination course in English Language and Literature, Mathematics and Science, together with four other subjects of their choice.

The key to our success as a school is ensuring that every child feels safe, secure and happy.

Our safeguarding and pastoral welfare system underpins everything we achieve. Throughout their time at Willingdon Community School, students are supported by a coach who sees them on a daily basis during the coaching period and, as far as possible, stays with them throughout their five years here. The coach acts as the first point of contact for parents or carers and monitors the overall progress and wellbeing of those in their group.

We place great importance on a strong pastoral system, as students need support to develop and overcome any hurdles whether emotional or academic. Each year group is led by a Head of Year (HOY) and they will support the transition the students experience as they progress through each year group. Also, they have a Pastoral Support Leader (PSL) who works alongside the HOY. These are non-teaching members of staff offering additional help and guidance for students. Further support is provided by the Inclusion Team and the school has invested in the services of a counsellor. Additionally, referrals can be made for Behaviour Intervention to our county advisors (TASS). We are also very proud that well over half of our staff have been trained as Mental Health First Aiders. We also have an extensive safeguarding team, which also supports schools locally to drive excellence in this area.

PROUD TO BE AN INCLUSIVE SCHOOL

Inclusion is at the Heart of Willingdon

At Willingdon Community School, we believe that every young person has the right to belong, achieve and flourish. Every child brings their own strengths, interests, experiences and individual needs, and we are committed to ensuring these are recognised, understood and celebrated.

Our approach to inclusion is rooted in our ambition for every student. We have high expectations for all and believe that additional needs or barriers to learning should never limit a young person's opportunities or aspirations. Our goal is not simply to ensure students can access education, but that they feel valued, confident and successful as members of our school community, developing the knowledge, skills and independence they need to thrive in life beyond school.

Inclusion is everyone's responsibility. It begins with excellent teaching and a curriculum that is ambitious, accessible and responsive to individual learners. Our teachers use a range of strategies and adaptations to remove barriers whilst maintaining consistently high expectations. Where additional support is needed, we work closely with students and families to understand strengths, identify needs early and put the right support in place.

Our Inclusion Team works alongside teachers, pastoral staff, families and specialist professionals to provide a graduated range of support. This may include targeted interventions, small-group or one-to-one support, adjustments to the learning environment, specialist advice and carefully planned additional provision. We continually review the impact of support to ensure it remains responsive to the needs of each young person.

We are particularly proud of our Deaf Support Facility, which enables deaf students to learn alongside their peers whilst benefiting from specialist support from a Teacher of the Deaf and Educational Audiology services.

We also recognise that inclusion extends beyond SEND. Students may face challenges linked to disadvantage, social, emotional or mental health needs, care experience, attendance difficulties or family circumstances. Our pastoral and inclusion teams work closely together to identify concerns early, provide appropriate support and ensure every student feels known, valued and able to succeed.

Working together with families

We believe that parents and carers are essential partners in understanding and supporting their child. We listen carefully to the views of students and families and work collaboratively to build a shared understanding of strengths, needs and the support that will make the greatest difference.

Transition is a particularly important part of our work. We collaborate closely with feeder primary schools to understand each child's individual profile before they join us. Information is shared with teaching and pastoral staff so that support, relationships and routines are established from the very beginning of Year 7, helping students feel secure, confident and ready to learn.

Nurture, Belonging and Participation

We know that children learn best when they feel safe, understood and connected. Alongside our high expectations for behaviour, learning and achievement, we provide a nurturing environment where students can develop resilience, confidence and a positive sense of self.

Our ambition is simple:

ENRICHING YOUR SCHOOL LIFE

At Willingdon Community School, we believe that learning extends far beyond the classroom. YOUR JOURNEY BEYOND WILLINGDON



Our priority is for students to reach their potential during their school journey and for this to be reflected in their public examination results. Although students move on from Willingdon Community School for post-16 education, we will ensure that students have developed key transferable skills to adapt to their next destination and as confident learners are ready to embrace life to the full. To demonstrate this commitment we have been awarded, by the Investors in Careers, a nationally recognisable body as 'Fully meeting all the accreditation criteria incorporating the Gatsby Benchmarks' for the National Quality Award for Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance Provision.

Through our comprehensive careers programme which begins in Year 7, all students will receive a robust careers curriculum linked to the 8 Gatsby Benchmarks of Good Career Guidance. Students will learn from career and labour market information and experience encounters with employers, employees and different workplaces to ensure that they are post-16 ready and have knowledge of over 400 different careers.

To ensure students understand the benefits of both further and higher education, we have developed strong links with local and national universities and colleges. All students have the opportunity to visit and gain an understanding of university life and the benefits of achieving a degree. We work closely with many of the local colleges and support students on taster days during Key Stage 4.

A comprehensive work experience programme exists for students in Key Stage 4, providing first hand insights into the world of work and we also welcome different speakers into our school to educate and enthuse students about future careers and the vast range of choices available to them.



OUR LIBRARY



Our library is at the heart of our school building. An inclusive and accessible space to allow study, reading for pleasure and the opportunity for students to fulfil their potential.

Use of the Library

KS3 students have one dedicated 'Reading for Pleasure' lesson per week as part of their English lessons. Across the school year, students will: visit the school library to browse and read for pleasure, engage in online author book talks, share reading in groups, write book reviews, and take part in termly reading conversations. Year 7 and 8 students are also involved in BookBuzz from the BookTrust, thanks to the sponsorship of the Friends of Willingdon School.

Our enticing books are grouped in themes linked to the #inmyshoesWCS challenge so that all students can find something to capture their imaginations. Each term students build their empathy skills using the feelings wheel vocabulary to enrich their book talk.

Current sections include: about life, adventure, animal stories, based on real life, comics, crime, dystopian and scary, fantasy, funny, graphic novels, mythology, non-fiction, poetry and plays, sci-fi, sport, dyslexia friendly super readable, war, quick reads, and study zone guides.

Students have the opportunity to enhance their scope of reading and to engage with new texts through the Southern School Book Award and the UKLA Book Award. Each year we develop our stock with new and enticing texts from a range of genres to ensure there is something delicious to read for everyone. A study zone area allows KS4 students to revise and study calmly and quietly with the resources they need to support them.

Library resources

Our library is equipped with a bank of laptops to aid revision and study, a wheelchair accessible desk and SEND friendly seating including wobble cushions and variety of seating to help everyone concentrate and enjoy the space quietly. Our study zone area includes a range of study resources and text books that students can use to support their revision whilst working in the library.

THE FOREST SCHOOL & BEACH SCHOOL

The Forest School

A key part of this provision is our on-site Forest School, which offers an immersive outdoor learning experience that complements traditional classroom teaching. Working alongside specialist off-site opportunities, students participate in regular outdoor sessions and hands-on sensory activities that encourage creativity, teamwork, problem-solving and communication.

Forest School nurtures curiosity and exploration while helping students develop resilience, self-confidence and emotional regulation. It provides opportunities for students to connect with nature, strengthen their physical and mental wellbeing, and develop valuable social skills in a supportive environment. Guided by trained staff, students learn to respect and care for the natural world while gaining life skills that extend far beyond the classroom.

The impact of Forest School is often best described by our students themselves: *"It helps me concentrate", "I feel it improves my focus", "It helps me calm down", "Allows me to work with different students", "It helps me to open up for learning", "It makes me want to attend school"*



The Beach School

We are also incredibly proud to be leading the Beach School initiative across Eastbourne, creating opportunities for children and young people to benefit from the unique learning environment provided by our coastline. Beach School uses the natural coastal environment as an inspiring and engaging classroom. Through carefully planned experiences, students deepen their understanding of subjects including science, geography, mathematics, art, literacy and physical education, while developing curiosity, creativity and practical skills.

The benefits extend well beyond the curriculum. Time spent by the coast supports mental health and wellbeing, offering opportunities to connect with nature, be physically active, build confidence, develop resilience and experience a sense of calm. By combining meaningful learning with wider personal development, Beach School helps young people grow academically, socially and emotionally.

Our official launch is planned for June 2027 and marks an exciting step towards our ambition of making beach-based learning accessible to children and young people across Eastbourne.





FRIENDS OF WILLINGDON

The Friends of Willingdon are a group of parents, carers and supporters who seek to provide a link between the school, home and community through the organisation of a wide range of events which are not only a great deal of fun and a fantastic way to make new friends, but also an opportunity to fundraise for school projects to enhance and enrich all our children's school lives.

In recent years, they have been very proud to present a new minibus to the school, a vision that seemed all but impossible a few years ago! They have also given the school a new laser cutter for the DT department, table tennis tables for PE as well as supporting the purchase of various curriculum based items that would not have been affordable for the school. The Friends have for the past two years funded Bookbuzz, a reading initiative for all our Year 7 students. The Friends have also supported many activities of the school, including sponsored walk, Christmas concert, school play and Phoenix Festival in the summer. The Friends also organise and host a very successful firework event, in conjunction with a local primary school, and regularly raise over £2,500 for the school each time. We already have a date in the diary for this event to take place this Autumn. The Friends also host the annual Christmas Fayre as well as supporting other school events throughout the year and are always looking for new members and new ideas to further support the school. OUR AMAZING SPORTS FACILITIES

Supporting Physical Wellbeing

The PE Department is proud to have achieved the Gold School Games Award 2025/26, recognising our commitment to sport, physical activity, leadership and inclusion.

Students benefit from outstanding facilities, including a four-court Sports Hall, purpose-built dance studio, extensive outdoor spaces, a 400-metre athletics track, full-size football and rugby pitches, and a fleet of 25 mountain bikes. These facilities support a broad and engaging curriculum, alongside a wide-ranging extracurricular programme that encourages every student to develop confidence, resilience and a lifelong enjoyment of physical activity. Willingdon has a proud sporting tradition. Our teams compete successfully across a range of sports and regularly achieve league titles, county cup success and tournament honours, providing students with opportunities to challenge themselves and excel.

Leadership is central to our sporting provision. Students develop communication, teamwork and organisational skills through competitions, festivals and School Games initiatives. Our Sports Leaders also support primary sporting events and festivals, helping younger children build confidence, enjoy physical activity and develop positive relationships with our school before transition. Beyond the school day, our facilities play an important role within the wider community. We host sporting events and competitions for local schools and provide high-quality facilities that are used extensively by community groups and clubs.

Set against the backdrop of the South Downs, PE and Dance at Willingdon offers inclusive, ambitious and enjoyable opportunities for every student to participate, achieve success, develop leadership skills and discover their personal excellence through sport and physical activity.

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
