JOB TITLE:	Trainee Science Technician
HOURS:	3 days per week / term time only
GRADE:	Single Status Grade 3/4
RESPONSIBLE TO:	Senior Science Technician

MAIN PURPOSE OF THE ROLE:

To work under the direction of an experienced science technician to gain all the knowledge and skills required to perform the duties unsupervised.

Key tasks:

- Attend induction and other training offered by the school and County Council to develop knowledge of Health & Safety, COSHH and ESCC regulations relevant to the role.
- Deliver resources and equipment to rooms.
- Set out equipment and resources in preparation for lessons
- Collect, check and return equipment to stores.
- Clean and clear laboratories of equipment and materials after use, ensuring rooms are left clean, tidy and in good order.
- After training and under direct supervision, to prepare chemicals and solutions for school use, ensuring safe handling and storage in line with Health & Safety and COSHH regulations.
- After training and under direct supervision, to make up and maintain class sets of equipment, chemicals and resources.
- Carry out routine maintenance of equipment, reporting any problems to an experienced technician.
- Assist in annual stock checks and spring cleaning of storage areas.
- Set up and maintain audio visual aids.
- Maintain and propagate plants necessary for practical lessons.

- After proper First Aid training, to deal with minor incidences in the laboratory and, where necessary, contact school welfare.
- Manage any worksheets relating to lessons including filing and photocopying.
- After training and under supervision, to use an autoclave to prepare sterile inoculating plates and demonstrate sound sterile techniques.
- Contribute to the overall ethos/work/aims of the school.
- To take part in training activities offered to further professional knowledge and development.
- Be aware of the school's Health and Safety policies and take personal responsibility for ensuring they are put into practice.
- All school based staff have the responsibility for promoting the safeguarding and welfare of children. All school staff should be aware of the school's Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy and work in accordance with this document at all times.
- To carry out the above duties in accordance with the County Council's Equal Opportunities Policy.
- To perform such other tasks as may reasonably be required appropriate to the grading of the post.

The post holder should be aware of and comply with all school policies and procedures relating to child protection, health, safety and security, confidentiality and data protection, reporting all concerns to an appropriate person.

This job description sets out the duties of the post at the time it was drawn up. Such duties may vary from time to time without changing the general character of the duties or the level of responsibility entailed. Such variations are a common occurrence and cannot of themselves justify a reconsideration of the grading of the post.
