### **Student Transition**

Although it is six months to the start of the next school year, I am sure you would like to know about the preparations we shall be making in order to get to know your child and to prepare for them to make a positive start in their new school.

The Director of Student Progress for Transition, will be visiting the primary schools later this year along with the year team to discuss transition with your child's teachers and gather information on friendship groups, in order that tutor groups can be assigned. They will be learning as much as possible about your child in terms of abilities, interests and needs. Mrs Ollie Barber (SENCO) will also be in contact with primary SENCOs to gather any relevant information on students with SEN. A bespoke programme will be set up for students who require more support with the transition process.

## Students Welcome

In July there are two key events targeted at starting the process of familiarising your child with the school and a number of the staff who will be working closely with them.

The first is when you and your child are invited to an evening event where we will talk more specifically about transition. Students will be informed of which tutor group they will be joining and will meet their form tutor. In addition, there may be the opportunity to purchase school uniform and mathematics equipment. A letter inviting you to this will be sent out in May and we will confirm then whether this will be held in person or remotely.
