



Results Day and Appeals

Dear Year 11 Parents,

We hope that the students are enjoying a wonderful summer before they take their next steps in education and life. We would like to thank you once again for supporting a positive end to Term 5 for our Year 11 students. The final assessments were completed calmly and positively, and we do not underestimate how much impact your effort from home has had on this process.

Results Day

We will hold an in-person results day on the 12th of August. We believe that this gives the students a sense of closure and, like last year, we will put steps in place to make the day as safe as possible in terms of public health.

We are organising different time slots for surname letters to avoid crowding. We ask that students only arrive for their time.

Here are the time slots:

Surnames beginning A-D: 9.00-9.30

Surnames beginning E-H: 9.30-10.00

Surnames beginning I-N: 10.00-10.30

Surnames beginning O-S: 10.30-11.00

Surnames beginning T-Z: 11.00-11.30

Students will come in the front gate, through Reception, then on to the main hall to collect their results. We will ask students to follow a simple one-way system, leaving the hall by the side doors. As always, students should not come to school if they are experiencing any coronavirus symptoms. We also ask that the students come into the school building alone (without family) to keep the number of people on site low.

If we do not see students on the 12th, we will post their results home later that day – please ensure that we have the correct address if you have moved recently.

Appeals information

We pride ourselves on clear communication and we hope that you feel you have been kept informed about our grading process: the Centre Policy, assessment schedule, student declarations and other key information. This should minimise the need for appeals, but we do need to make it clear that you are entitled to appeal. Here is a very brief overview of how appeals will work this year.

With any appeal, students need to be aware that grades can stay the same, move up or move down.

Appeals would start with a Centre Review if students believe that the school has failed to follow its procedures properly or has made an administrative error.

The request would need to be with the school by the 3rd of September. Depending on the outcome of this initial review, further possible types of appeal can be submitted.
