If you want to consolidate your basic foundation geographical knowledge, then start by practising the Foundation questions. How to revise:	Tips to Answer Common/Extended Questions:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❖ Eat well, sleep well ❖ 'Chunk It' – use the learning checklists to plan your revision into small chunks of about 20 minutes each ❖ Revise somewhere quiet, without distractions ❖ Take part in the 'question a day' incentive ❖ Use the Doodle software to watch presentations for topics you are less sure about and use the quizzes to test yourselves. ❖ Ensure that you attend the targeted invitation support revision sessions suggested by your teacher ❖ Check the content revision schedule and decide which topics you might need support with. ❖ Test your knowledge by doing flash cards with family or play Taboo, Pictionary and 'Heads Up' for key terms and key processes/ landforms. ❖ Practise your case studies in a fun and unique way – maybe by inventing a character or by doing it in an accent! ❖ Practising past questions will help you to develop your skills at effectively linking your ideas using specialist key terms and ensuring that you specifically answer the question being asked. 	<p>The questions will either test your skills, knowledge or understanding/ literacy.</p> <p>Skills: Check the skills checklist and make sure that you can comfortably do all the required geographical map skills, graph skills, and basic mathematical applications. For help with these you can use the Doodle website where there is practise and quizzes.</p> <p>Skills also include using photographic, satellite and aerial pictures. You have to be able to describe what you see, suggest reasons or use evidence from the pictures to support your answers.</p> <p>Knowledge: These questions are lower tariff questions. Make sure you revise all the key terms and sequences of land formations</p> <p>Understanding: These questions are longer and worth more marks. These are application questions and show how well you can answer commands as well as linking those to your own knowledge. Check the AQA website to ensure you know what the command words ask you for and practise LOTS and LOTS of questions.</p>
